## NOTIFICATION

The 10th June 1988

No 13482 -BF -4/88-F.F. A. H-Whereas the State Government considers that the area, the limits of which have been specified in Scheduled -"A" & "B" hereto annexed including river, private land and Government land between the boundary described in the said Schedules, situated under the Police Stations of Chandaka, Bhubaneswar and Bankl, in Bhubaneswar and Bankl Sub-Divisions in the Districts of Puri and Cuttack respectively is of adequate ecological, faunal, floral, geomorphological and Zoological significance, for the purpose of protecting, propagating and developing wild life,

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by section - 18 of the Wild Life (Protection) Act 1972, (53 of 1972) and in supersession of the notification of the Government of Orissa in the Forest, Fisheries and Animal Husbandry Dept. No 35500 dated the 21<sup>st</sup> December 1982, the State Government do hereby declare the aforesaid area to be a Sanctuary called as the Chandaka-Dampara Wild Life Sanctuary, with effect from the date of publication of this notification in the Official Gazette.

### SCHEDULE -A

#### Boundary Description

Starting from the boundary pillar No 39 of Haldi Range which is the meeting point of Tarkoi Reserved Forest, Barpita Reserved Forest and Sunakhani -I Protected Reserved Forests the boundary line of the Sanctuary travels towards Eastern direction with the bearing of  $87^{\circ}$  upto distance of 2.41 Km. It joins again district boundary of Puri and Cuttack and it follows the district boundary and forms a semi circular curve having distance of 3.62 Km. Thereafter, it passes North-Western direction with the bearing of  $337^{\circ}$  upto distance, where it forms a triangular shape with bearing of  $318^{\circ}$  upto distance of 0.96 km. Then it bends downward with bearing of  $191^{\circ}$  covering a distance of 0.96 km, it travels towards Western direction with

Southward along the Eastern Boundary of Dalua Demarcated Protected Forest for about 2.7 Ks upto pillar No 51 situated on the Southern side of the Barang- Khurda Public Works Department Road, where the Sanctuary line cuts across the said Public Works Department Road at Bearing of  $11.5^{\circ}$  and after following an artificial line at the same bearing for nearly 1.1 Kms over a patch of private land, it touches the pillar No 21 of Jagannathprasad protected Forests. From this boundary pillar, it runs Eastward along the Northern boundary of the aforesaid Demarcated Protected Forests for nearly 4.5Kms then taken a turn Southward and



follows the Eastern boundary of Jagannathprasad Demarcated Protected Forests and it meets the common boundary of Bharatpur Reserve Forests at pillar No 10 which is in common with pillar No 61 of Jagannathprasad Demarcated Protected Forest. It continues to run Southwards thereafter along the Eastern boundary of Bharatpur Reserve Forests for about 9.5 Kms then turns Westward and follows of the Southern boundary Thereafter it follows Western boundary of the same Reserve Forests in Northern direction up to the pillar No 8 of Bharatpur Reserve Forests where it touches again the common boundary of this Reserve Forests and Jagannathprasad Demarcated Protected Forests . From this point , it continues to run North-Western direction in a zig-zag way along the Western boundary of Jagannathprasad Demarcated Protected Forests up to pillar No 15 of this Demarcated Protected Forests where it cuts across the patch of private land from the aforesaid pillar No 15 of at a bearing of  $272.5^{\circ}$  and runs along an artificial line in the same bearing for nearly 2 kms before it meets pillar No 43 of Dalua Demarcated protected Forest . The Sanctuary boundary thereafter follows to Western Boundary of Dalua Demarcated Protected Forests and Southern boundary of Bhola Demarcated Protected Forests upto the meeting points of the boundaries of Barapita Reserve Forests and Bhola Demarcated Protected Forests. From this point, it cuts across a small private holding in Southern direction at a bearing of  $99^{\circ}$  and covers for nearly 0.15 Km and it touches Pillar No 10 of a Bhola Demarcated Protected Forest. It follows the Northern boundary of Bhola Demarcated Protected Forests upto the pillar No 2 of this protected forest where it again crosses the Barang-Khurda Public Works Department Road and a small patch of Private land, on the other side at bearing No  $123^{\circ}$  and after running for nearly 0.2 Kms across the said private land and Public Works Department Road it meets the Pillar No 6 of the Daspur protected Forests. The Boundary of the Sanctuary thereafter follows of the Eastern ,Southern and Western boundary of Daspur protected Forests till it again touches the Private land at Pillar No 7. It crosses again Barang-Khurda Public Works Department Road with the Private land on its either side along a artificial line over 0.35 km at a bearing of  $309^{\circ}$  at Pillar No 7 of the Daspur Protected Forests and it meets pillar No 15 of Bhola Protected in almost North-Western direction upto pillar No 12 where it out across another patch of private holding at bearing of  $274^{\circ}$  for nearly 0.4 Km and meets the boundary of Barapita Reserve Forest. Thereafter it follows Southern Boundary of Barapita Reserve Forests and then the Eastern Boundary of Derras Demarcated Protected Forests. Kodamunda –II Demarcated Protected Forests upto the common meeting point of Kodamunda – II Demarcated Protected Forest, Kodamunda – I Demarcated Protected Forests and Barapita Reserve Forest. From the point, the Sanctuary Boundary follows the Eastern boundary of Kodamunda – I Demarcated Protected Forests for about 3.85 Kms upto the point where Chhatabar-Khurda Rural Engineering organisation Road (Via Angarapada) almost touches the boundary of Kodamunda – I Demarcated Protected Forest. It cut across the said Rural Engineering Organisation Road

after running along it for about 0.65 Km and a patch of Private land at a bearing of 205 and runs along an artificial line for nearly 1.5 Kms before it touches the boundary of Tatanpur Demarcated Protected Forest . Thereafter the Sanctuary boundary follows The Eastern , Southern and Western boundary of Ratanpur Demarcated Protected Forested upto a point where it touches another patch of private land . It cut across the Chhatabar –Khurda Rural Engineering Organisation Road (Via – Angarpada) and the Private land on either side at a bearing of 302 and run along an artificial line over 0.8 Kms . in the same bearing till it meets the boundary of the Kodamunda – I Demarcated Protected Forested again. The Sanctuary boundary follow the Western Boundary of Kodamunda – I Demarcated Protected Forest and Southern and Western boundary of Bantala Protected d Forests ( Demarcated for reservation) upto the meeting point of the Bantala Protected Forests and Tarkoi Reserve Forests from this point, the Sanctuary boundary follows the Southern , Western and Northern boundary of Tarkei Reserve Forests till it meets the starting points , at the junction of boundaries of Tarkei Reserve Forest, Barapita Reserve Forests and Sunakhani – I Protected Forests.
